
## **ENERGIA – International Network** on Women and Sustainable Energy

NERGIA is an International Network on Women and Sustainable Energy, founded in 1995 to create an institutional base for galvanising action to strengthen the role of women in the energy sector. Energia is open to both men and women from the South and North interested in promoting its goal to "engender" energy and "empower" women, through the promotion of information exchange, training, research, advocacy and action aimed at sustainable energy development that is equitable for all. ENERGIA's approach is to seek to identify needed activities and actions through its membership, and then to encourage, and if pos-

sible assist, members and their institutions to undertake decentralised initiatives. Energia News is the principle vehicle for this approach.

A typical issue of ENERGIA News comprises: an editorial, letters to ENER-GIA, reports from networking around the world, a feature focusing on an international or regional organisation or program, 2-4 articles and case studies, training resources, internet resources, and a bulletin board. Eleven issues have been published since 1996 and all these can also be found on the web page at http:// www.energia.org. At present ENERGIA News has 1297 subscribers (about a quarter of whom are men) in 247 countries, with 60 % of subscribers in developing countries.

ENERGIA News is produced jointly by Energy, Environment and Development (EED, Kurten, Germany), the Technology and Development Group (TDG, Enschede, the Netherlands) and ETC Energy (Leusden, the Netherlands) which houses the secretariat. The focus is on
