## Development, NGOs, and Civil Society

*Introduction by Jenny Pearce*

As organisations of civil society, NGOs are a convenient channel through which donors can promote political pluralism. But can NGOs both facilitate governments' withdrawal from providing basic services and also represent the poor and the disenfranchised who depend on these services? Are NGOs legitimate political actors in their own right? Jenny Pearce addresses these tensions, and asks whether NGOs stand for anything fundamentally distinct from the agencies on whose largesse they increasingly depend.
